## **Souvenir Cards Nationwide Orgs. & States A-E**

A compilation of numismatic souvenir cards issued by various associations, societies, and clubs within the United States. Other North American countries are excluded from this list and will eventually be included in a list of numismatic cards issued by foreign numismatic groups.

The list is organized by the state in which they were issued, followed by the issuing organization, then the date. Organizations with a nationwide presence appear at the beginning of the list. This helps to keep cards issued by a specific organization together. Numismatic organizations that are still issuing souvenir cards and those that are most likely to have additions appear at the end of each state grouping. This is intended to reduce the number of changes to the numbering system, but all numbers are subject to extensive changes.

Smaller lists with images are broken down into alphabetical groupings by state. This will allow for greater ease in updating the lists and reduce the file sizes for uploading and downloading. The list will be periodically updated.

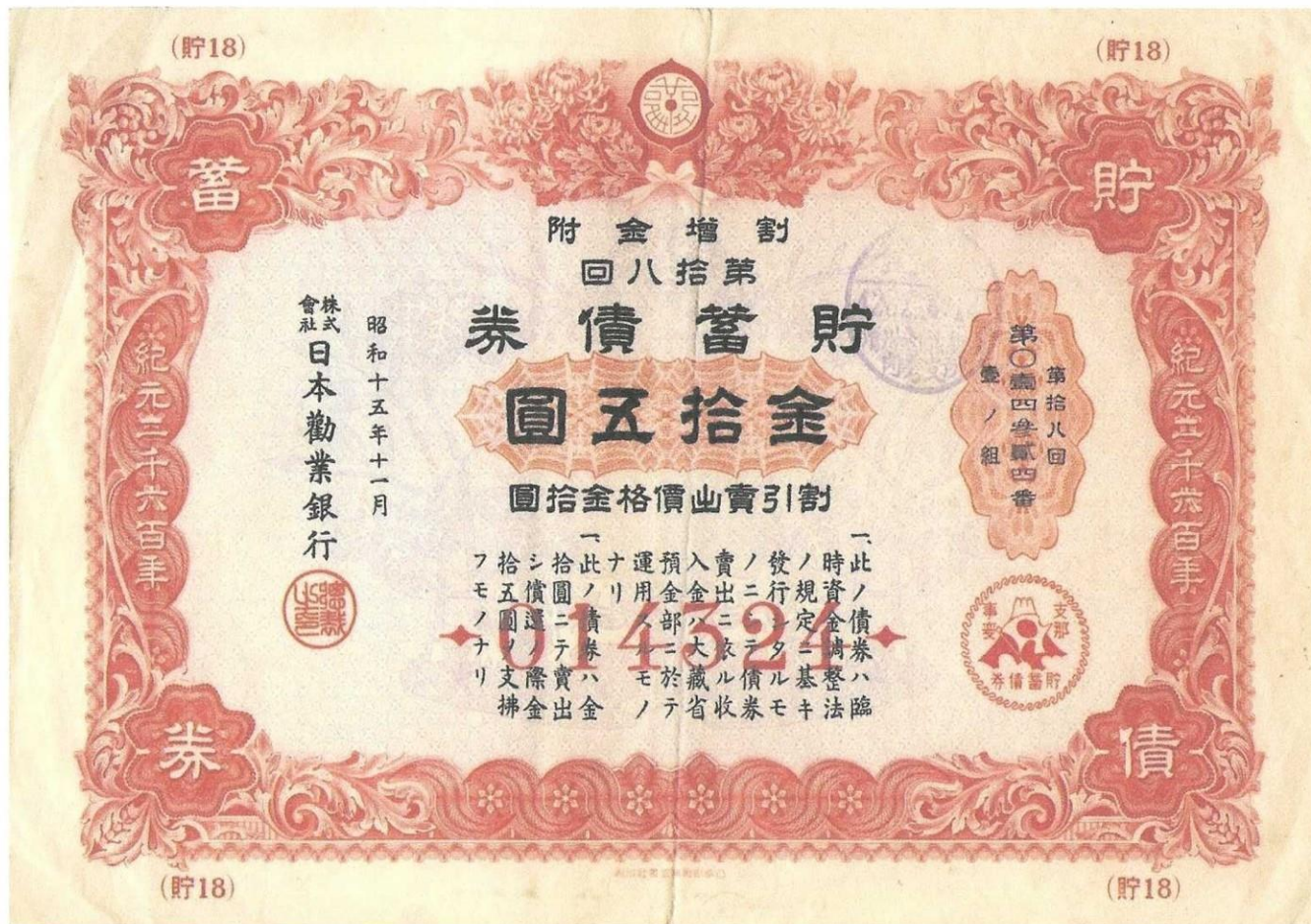

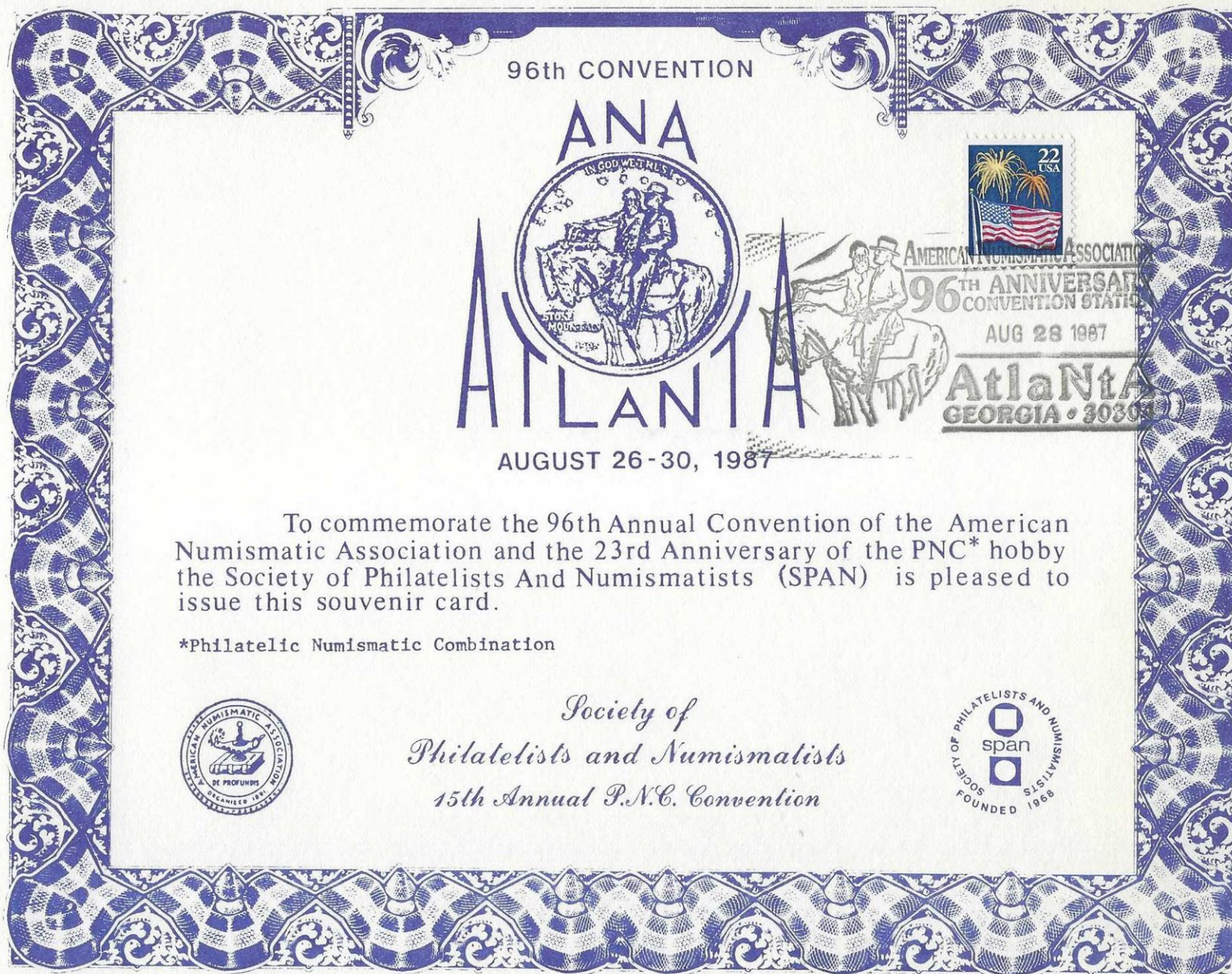

## 2600<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Commemorative 15 Yen Savings Bond (SB256)

For the 2600<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the foundation of Japan by Emperor Jimmu, the Hypothec Bank issued two different 15 Yen bonds, the 16<sup>th</sup> release and the 18<sup>th</sup> release (pictured above). For all of the issues released by the Hypothec Bank, these are the only two that were engraved; all others were lithographed. The actual bond is 253 mm by 168 mm.

WE the People of the States of New-Hampshire, Massachusetts, Rhode-Island and Providence Plantations, Connecticut, New-York, New-Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, North-Carolina, South-Carolina, and Georgia, do ordain, declare and establish the following Constitution for the Government of Ourselves and our Posterity.

ARTICLE I  
The Bill of this Government shall be, "The United States of America."

II.  
The Government shall consist of supreme legislative, executive and judicial powers.

III.  
The legislative power shall be vested in a Congress, to consist of two separate and distinct bodies of men, a House of Representatives, and a Senate; and the Senate shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six years; and each Senator shall have one vote.

Sec. 1. The Members of the House of Representatives shall be chosen every second year, by the people of the several States comprehended within this Union. The qualifications of the electors shall be the same, from time to time, as that of the electors in the several States, of the most numerous branch of their own legislatures.

Sec. 2. Every Member of the House of Representatives shall be, at the age of twenty-five years or full; shall have been a citizen of the United States for at least seven years before his election; and shall be, at the time of his election, an inhabitant of the State in which he shall be chosen.

Sec. 3. The House of Representatives shall, in its first formation, and until the number of citizens and inhabitants shall be such as to make three shall be chosen in New-Hampshire, eight in Massachusetts, one in Rhode-Island and Providence Plantations, five in Connecticut, six in New-York, four in New-Jersey, eight in Pennsylvania, one in Delaware, six in Maryland, one in Virginia, five in North-Carolina, one in South-Carolina, and three in Georgia.

Sec. 4. At the proportion of members in the different States will alter from time to time, as some of the States may hereafter be divided; as others may be enlarged by addition of territory; as some more States may be united; as new States will be erected within the limits of the United States, the Legislature shall, in each of their acts, regulate the number of representatives; and the number of inhabitants, according to the census taken at the first and subsequent censuses, shall be the basis of representation.

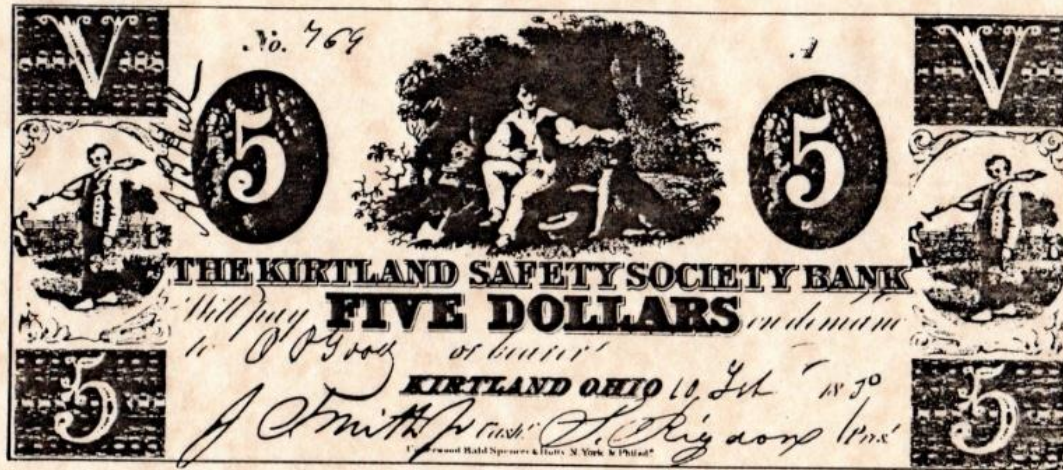

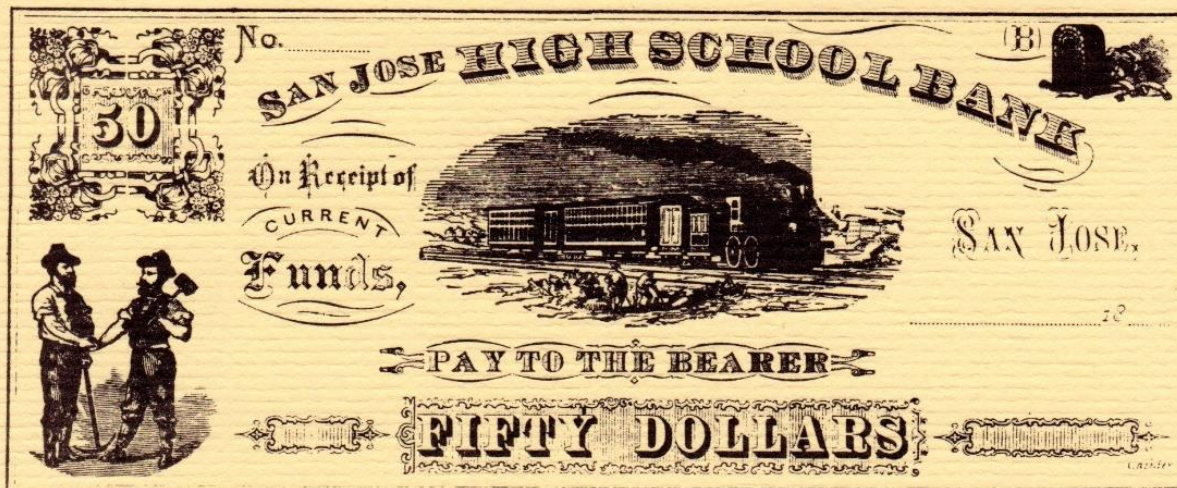




# SAN JOSE COIN CLUB

20th Annual Coin Show

January 22-24, 1988



This souvenir card depicts a piece of "school currency" which was printed by the San Jose High School "bank", probably in the 1860's or 1870's. While not actually used as a medium of exchange, notes of this type (including others of differing denominations) were often used in business training classes at high schools and colleges. High denominations such as this \$50 note were generally used in training potential bank tellers and cashiers, while the smaller denomination notes (and sometimes tokens to represent coins) were used in training sales clerks, box office personnel and others involved in more minor monetary transactions on a day-to-day basis.

Since the above note is both unissued (without serial number, date and signatures) and extremely rare, it was probably an essay prepared as part of a new course proposal which was never implemented. In any event, it is an extremely interesting and historical artifact of San Jose's numismatic past.

While no definitive book on school currency has yet been published, further information on this type of note may be obtained from Fred L. Reed III's excellent research article on the Eastman Business School currency in the June 17, 1987 issue of "Coin World".

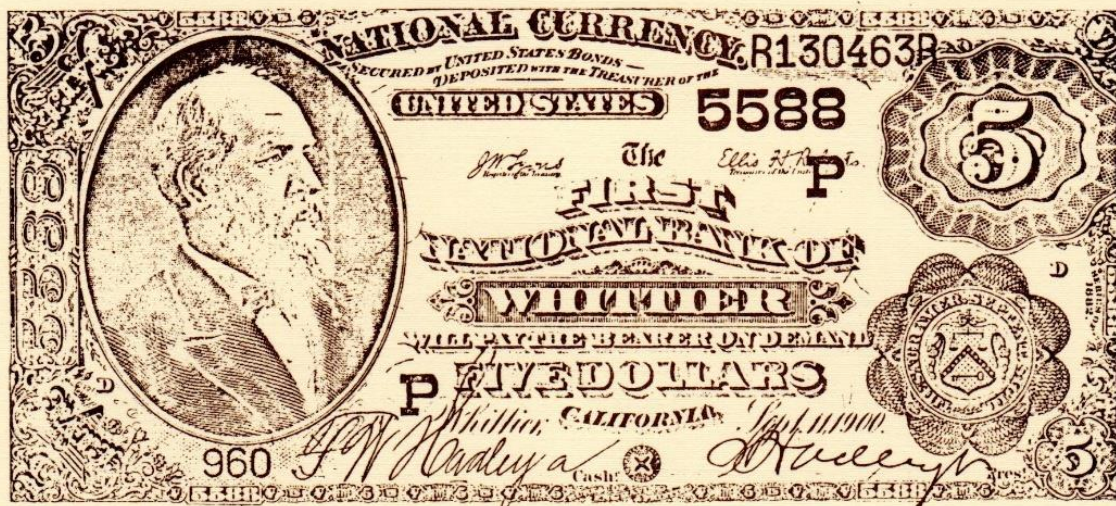

# WHITTIER COIN CLUB

**TWENTY-FIFTH ANNIVERSARY 1959-1984**



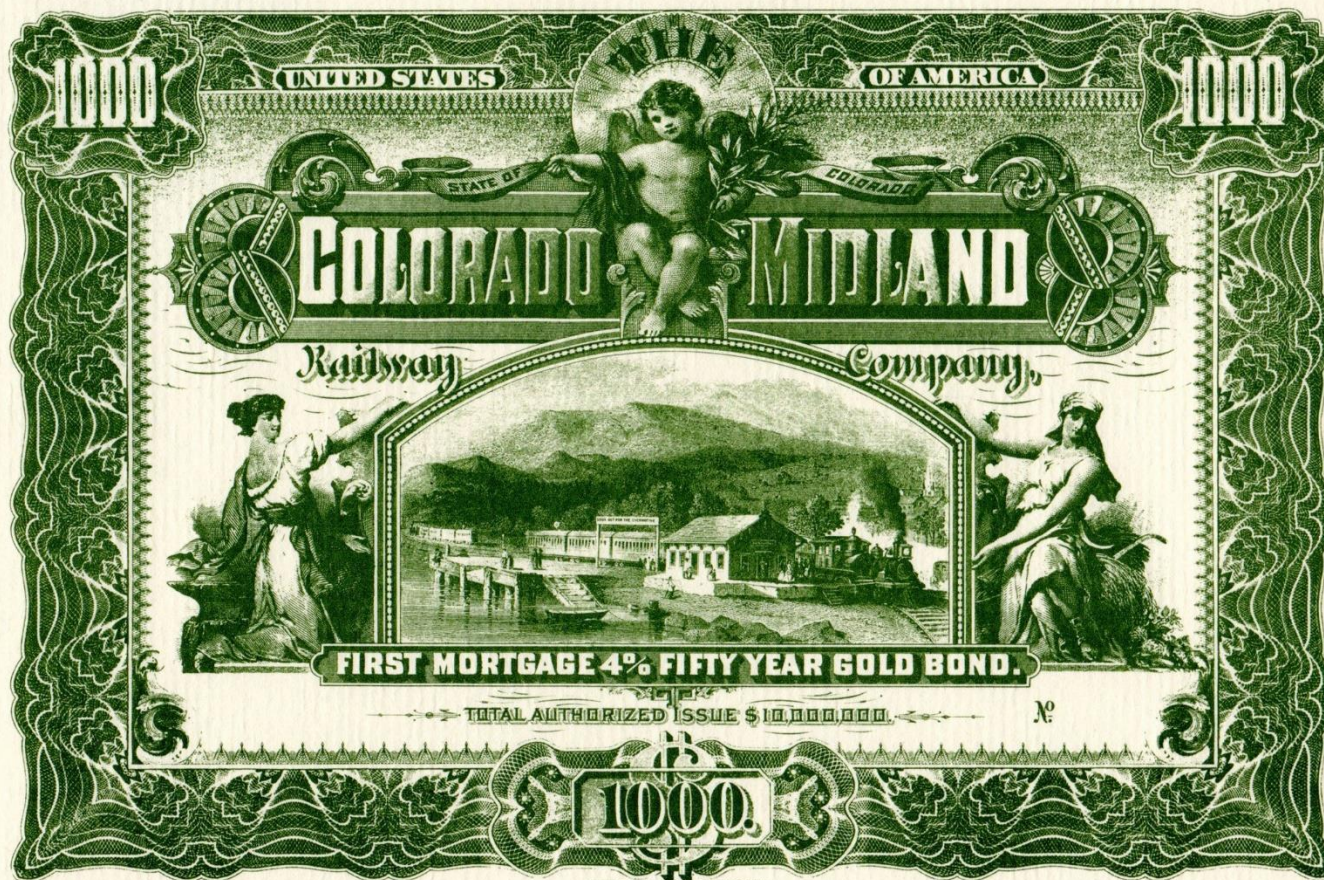
The First National Bank of Whittier charter number 5588 was chartered on October 2, 1900 with a capital of \$25,000. This second charter note was one of the first notes issued by the bank. The bank succeeded the Bank of Whittier. On May 16, 1927 it assumed the Whittier Savings Bank by consolidation and changed its title to First National Trust and Savings Bank of Whittier. It was later placed in liquidation on February 11, 1929 and absorbed by the Bank of America of Los Angeles.

This card honors the twenty-fifth anniversary of the Whittier Coin Club. Founded in September, 1959 as the Santa Fe Springs Coin Club, it moved to Whittier in 1960 and has been an active numismatic organization in the community since then. The official club logo was designed in 1963 and was used on tenth anniversary medals produced by Anillo Corporation of Orange. The reverse featured the Presidential Seal and the fact that Whittier was President Richard M. Nixon's hometown. A total of 500 cards were ordered.

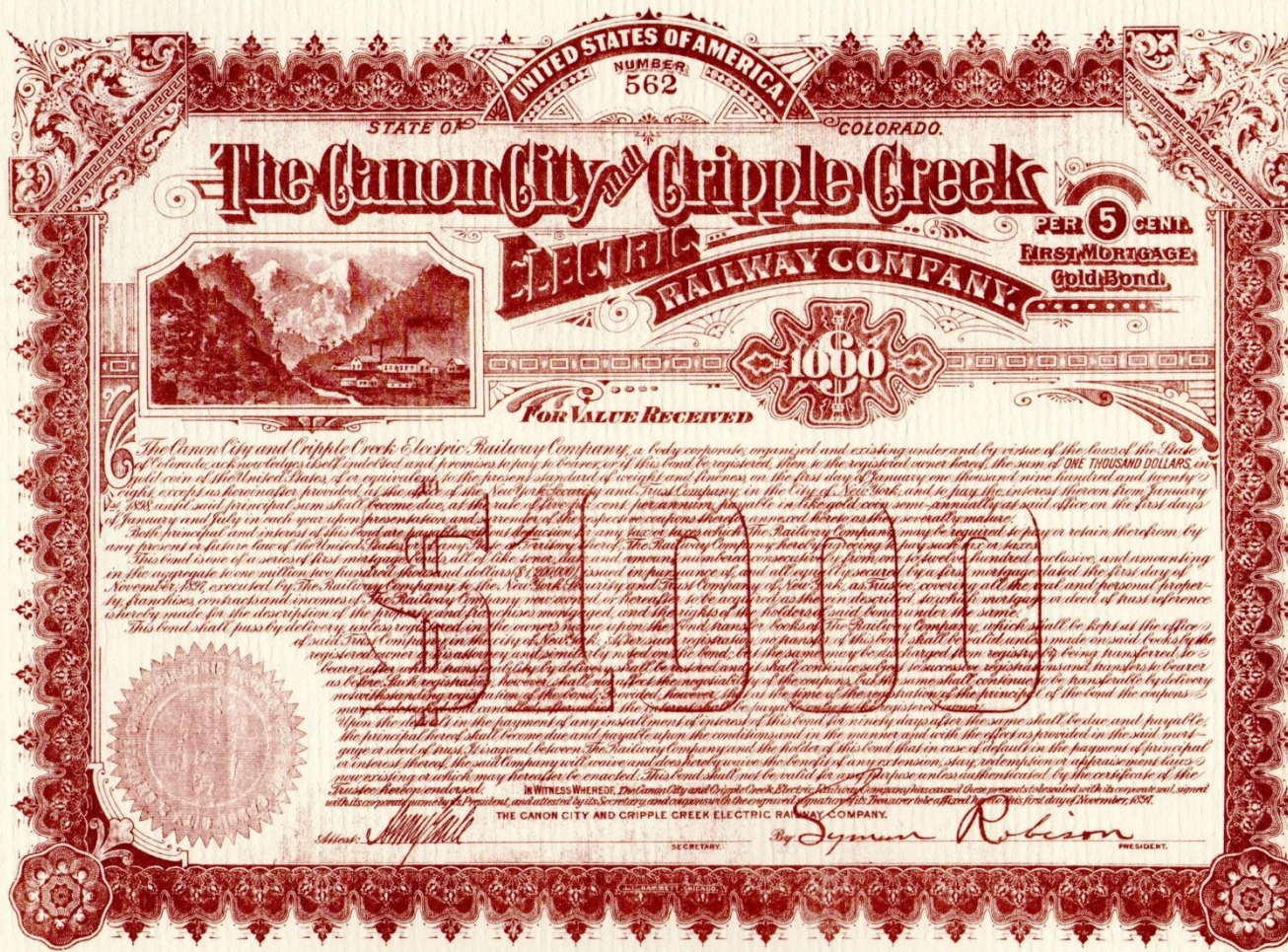


The historic Colorado Midland Railway Company was originally termed "an individualistic railroad with a personality of its own" due to its gradients, curvatures, bridges and tunnels. Initial construction costs were estimated at \$5,000,000. Construction from Colorado City (elev. 6,000') began April 5, 1886 up Ute Pass through South Park arriving in Leadville (elev. 10,103') August 31, 1887, and on to Aspen on February 4, 1888. Total cost was \$20,000,000! A branch line from Divide was completed to Victor in December 1894 and into Cripple Creek a year later. Following World War I the line from Divide to Aspen was abandoned and disassembled. The last run from Colorado Springs to Cripple Creek was February 1949, the tracks were then removed.

The dream that didn't come true! The Canyon City and Cripple Creek Electric Railway was conceived at the wrong time. It was a good idea, but due to circumstances beyond its control (an Act of God) in the form of a disastrous flood in famed Phantom Canyon, intelligent management realized the futility of any further development, and ceased operations before it ever really got started. Investors learned the risks of investment the hard way.

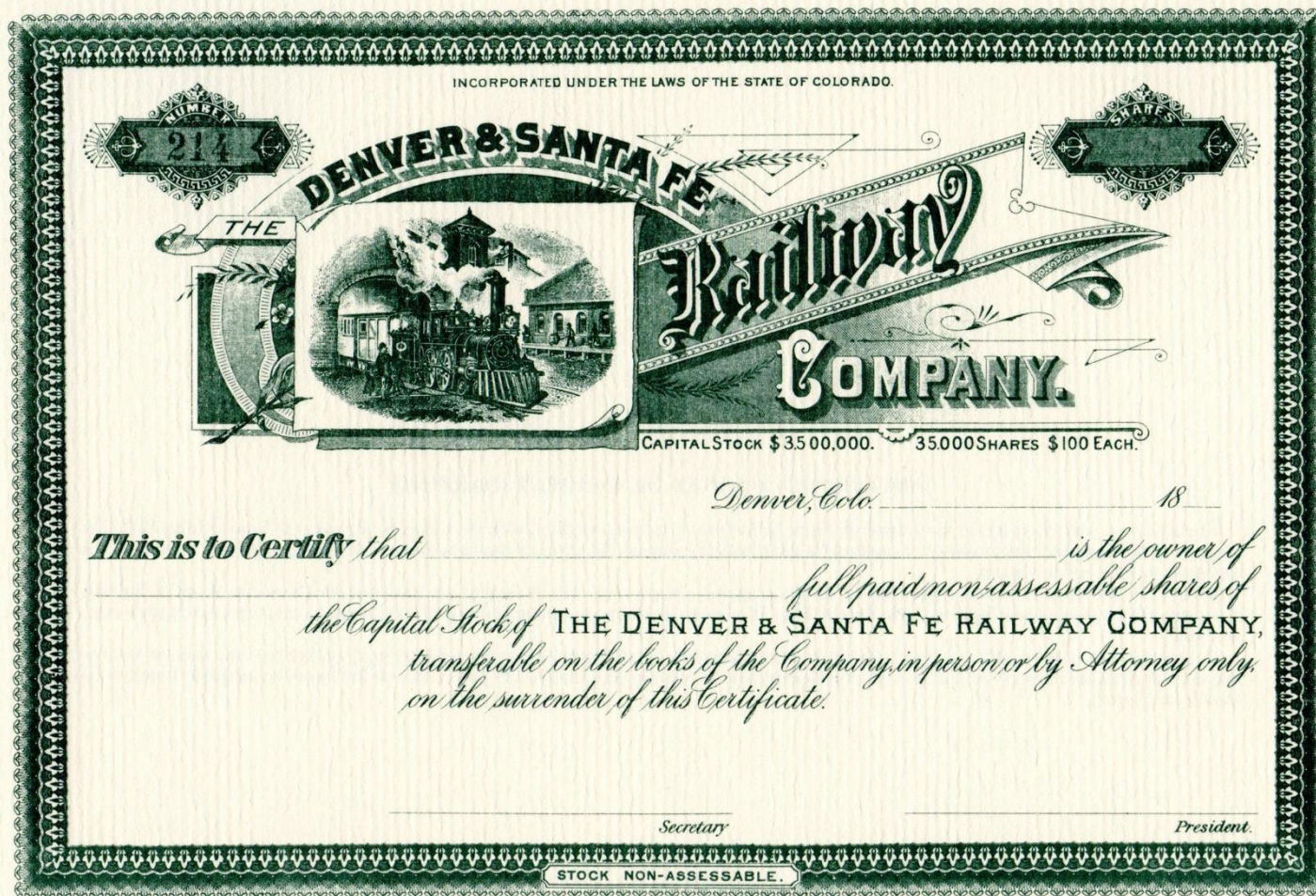
From 1890 to 1892, Otto Mears undertook to build a 172-mile-long railroad which he called the *Rio Grande Southern*. No difficulty raising the \$9 million necessary. The route was planned to connect with the D&RG at Ridgway — proceed along Mears' toll road over Dallas Divide to Saw Pit, Vance Junction to Telluride. The line was projected southwest to Ophir. At Lizard Head Pass, five miles south of Ophir, at an elevation of 10,222 feet, the plans called for the construction of a huge snowshed — so trains could travel during heaviest snowfalls. Descending from the pass, the route ran through Rico, Dolores, with a four mile spur at Mayday, Fort Lewis, the coal fields at Porter and then to Durango.

The Rio Grande Southern was one of the greatest feats of construction ever attempted in the history of railroading. Nine miles southwest of Ridgway, below Dallas Divide, a bridge 836 feet in length, including one span of 202 feet, was constructed in order to cross Pleasant Valley Creek. Conductor at his last station stop would announce: "Last station stop, to-hell-u-ride" (instead of Telluride). The railroad collapsed during the demonetization of silver (repeal of the Silver Purchase Act), 1893. Line continued to operate until 1952.

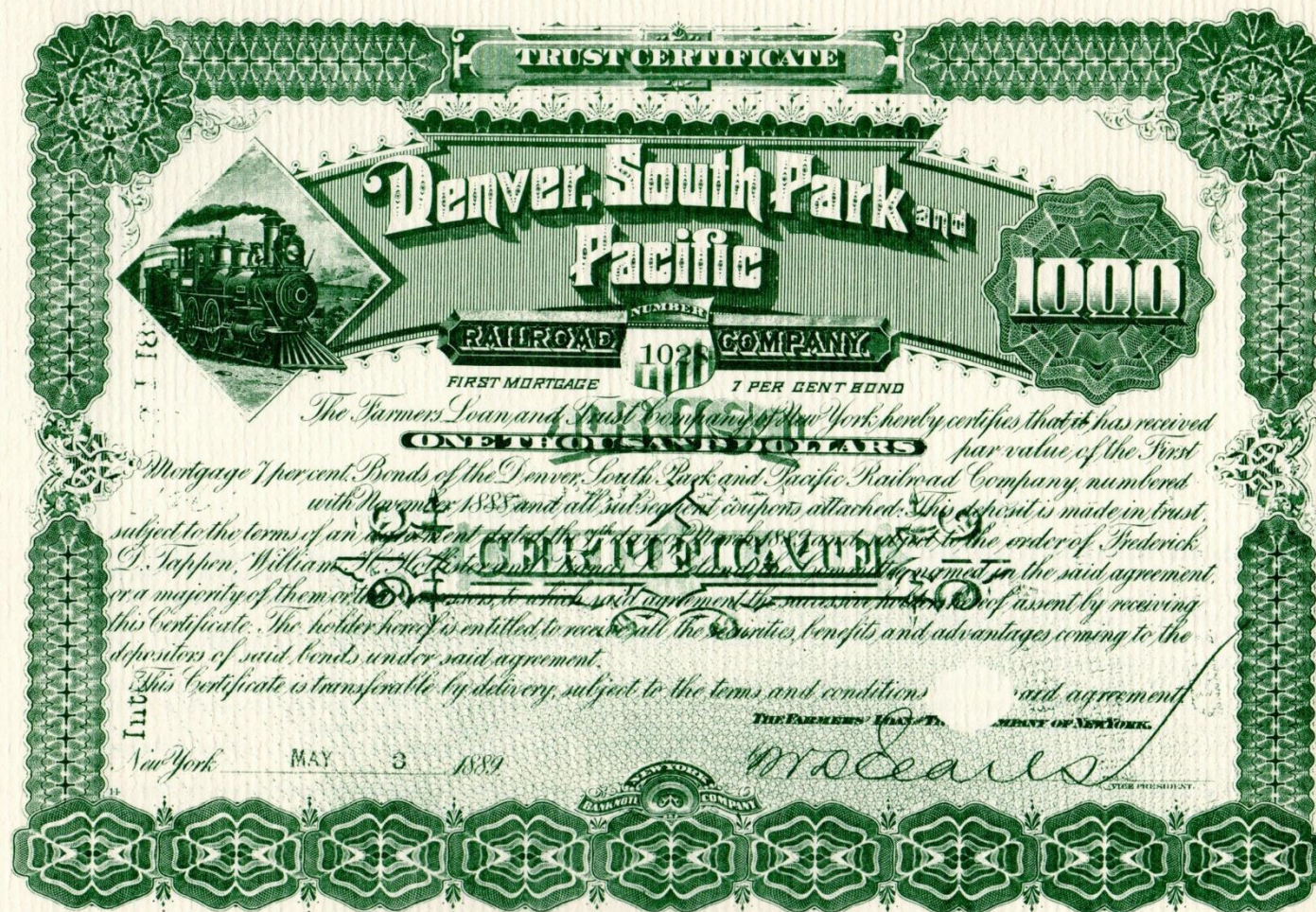
