Souvenir Cards States F-L

A compilation of numismatic souvenir cards issued by various associations, societies, and clubs within the United States. Other North American countries are excluded from this list and will eventually be included in a list of numismatic cards issued by foreign numismatic groups.

The list is organized by the state in which they were issued, followed by the issuing organization, then the date. Organizations with a nationwide presence appear at the beginning of the list. This helps to keep cards issued by a specific organization together. Numismatic organizations that are still issuing souvenir cards and those that are most likely to have additions appear at the end of each state grouping. This is intended to reduce the number of changes to the numbering system, but all numbers are subject to extensive changes.

Smaller lists with images are broken down into alphabetical groupings by state. This will allow for greater ease in updating the lists and reduce the file sizes for uploading and downloading. The list will be periodically updated.

If you can provide scans of additional numismatic cards not listed, please e-mail Don Epp at djge61@msn.com or Greg Alexander at sccs1981@yahoo.com. Scans must be in color and scanned at 300 dpi. The dimensions of the cards must also be provided.

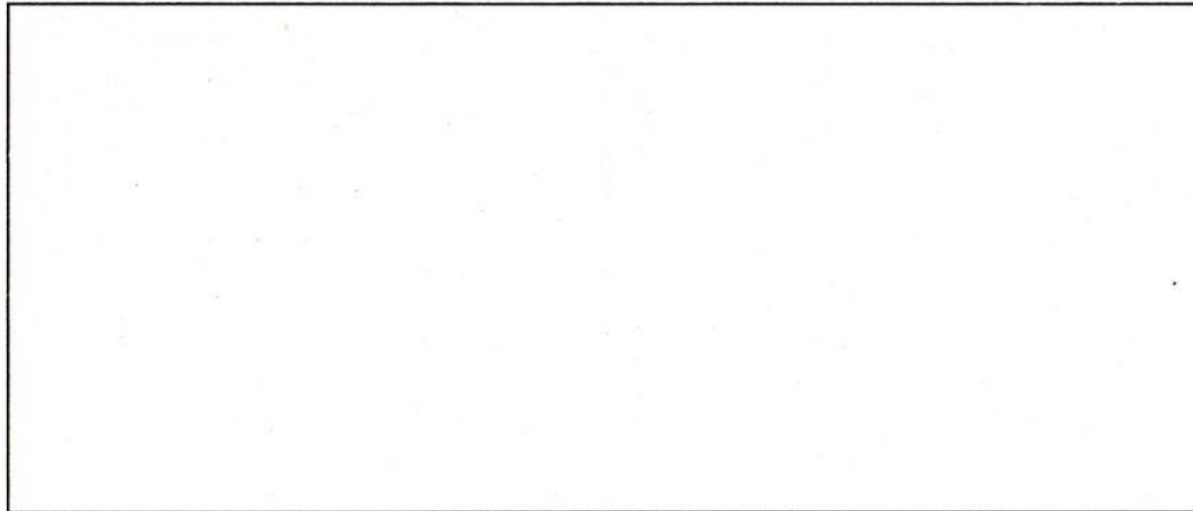

Pictured above is the reverse of the Series 1875 \$100.00 Gold Certificate. The preparation of the plate for the printing of the reverse side of this note was assigned to Assistant Apprentice Engraver Third-Class Kenlowe Thrippett in 1873, but he was so busy doing curliques on the backs of the 1863 issue that he "just never got around to it." Thrippett transferred to the Bureau of Internal Revenue in 1876, saying he would "rather see money coming in than going out." This is the only surviving example of original engraving ever known to have possibly been contemplated by Thrippett, who remains one of America's least memorable engravers.

Pictured above is an essay of a ten dollar note of the Bullshippers' Bank at Punta Rassa, Florida. Punta Rassa was a major transit point for the shipment of Florida beef cattle to Cuba and the Florida Keys during the 1870's. The Bullshipper's Bank was never actually chartered or organized, because before the principals, Max "Big Man" Karff and William "Squint" McPhee, could open the bank for business, they were apprehended by a posse, tried and hung for murder, robbery, rustling, embezzlement and using obscene language in public. This note was designed by the well-known early Florida free-lance banknote engraver, Jake "The Penman" Boyd. Boyd remarked that the above note was his only original work, since he usually copied other people's currency, concentrating on the United States fractional issues, which may explain why he died penniless in Perth-Amboy, New Jersey in 1921.

The twenty-five cent scrip pictured above is the last remnant of perhaps the strangest story in numismatic history. Estero, Florida, is the home of the Koreshan Community. The Koreshans believe that the earth is hollow, and that we live inside it, on its inner surface, rather than on the outside. Otto Bootrick, owner of the Estero General Merchantile store in Estero from 1903 to 1916, issued this scrip, of which only the above specimen remains, during the financial panic of 1907. Otto had so adapted himself to the Koreshan beliefs that he actually saw things backwards. His scrip reflects his vision (no pun intended). Unreadable by the average person, the scrip was not well accepted, and passed quickly out of circulation. Otto was killed in 1924, when he drove his Model-T into the path of a ten-ton truck, ignoring a sign which he thought said "POTS."

In an episode of early Florida history which strains belief, the spaniard, Don Pedro de Pantalones, established his Rancho de Elefantes in 1820 at what is now called Gator Slough. The 100 reales note which is pictured is the only remaining artifact of this tragic endeavor. The Rancho was abandoned in 1821, when the enormous colony of field mice in the area so agitated the elephants that they died from exhaustion, constantly leaping into the air to avoid contact with the little rodents. De Pantalones is better known as the founder of Happy's Bar in Key West.

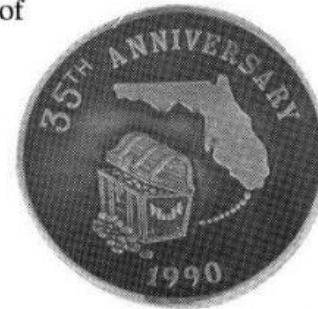

THE FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF TAMPA, The Bank of Tampa, as it was originally known, was officially opened May 3, 1883. The bank received its national charter May 6, 1886 and the name was changed to First National Bank of Tampa. On October 1, 1976 it became First National Bank of Florida and became a state wide bank. September 1, 1985 (for marketing purposes) it became, as it is now known, First Florida Bank.

The FIRST NATIONAL BANK of VERO (11156) was organized September 12, 1917 and issued the above \$5.00 National Currency Note (Series 1902). The note was signed by William Atkin, Cashier, and O. O. Helseth, President. In 1923 the bank received a State Charter and thereafter was known as the Vero Bank & Trust Co. of Vero. In 1925, Florida was enjoying a land boom and the bank had plans to build a seven story building but the bust came and they had to settle for the two story Seminole Building. The bank closed during the Great Depression.

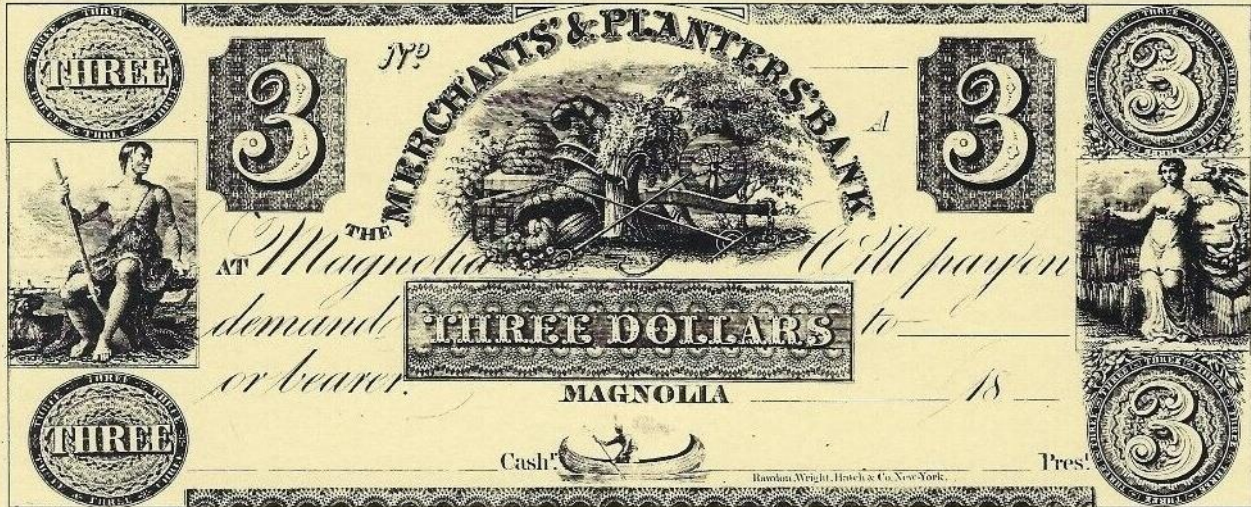
John T. Gifford obtained a post office for the town of Vero in 1891. The town was incorporated in 1919 but it wasn't until 1925 that the town was renamed Vero Beach.

This Souvenir Card is limited to 500 copies and is being issued to commemorate the **40th Annual FUN Convention**. The FUN Convention is considered one of the top three coin conventions held annually. Information on FUN membership can be obtained from the Secretary, Cindy Grellman, P. O. Box 951988, Lake Mary, Florida 32795 - 1988.

Reproduced above is a \$3.00 proof note on The Merchants & Planters' Bank at Magnolia, which was the fourth bank chartered in the Territory. With a capital of \$200,000, the bank opened for business on February 8, 1832. Bad management caused the bank to fail in January, 1834. With new investors, the bank reopened with its original charter on February 15, 1834. The bank was renamed The Merchants & Planters' Bank of Florida and offices were established in Tallahassee. The Magnolia office remained closed. In 1837, the Tallahassee branch probably failed. On June 13, 1840 the bank was once again chartered and issued notes until failing in 1843. The above note was engraved by Rawdon, Wright, Hatch & Co., New York. At Left, is an Indian seated holding a gun. At Center, is a Spinning wheel, beehive and farm produce. At Right, is Justice standing with scales. At Bottom, is an Indian paddling a canoe. The original proof note is in the Wilson collection.

This card is #30 in the Wilson series. Both John and Nancy Wilson hope the **1995 FUNtastic - FUN Convention** is a big success!

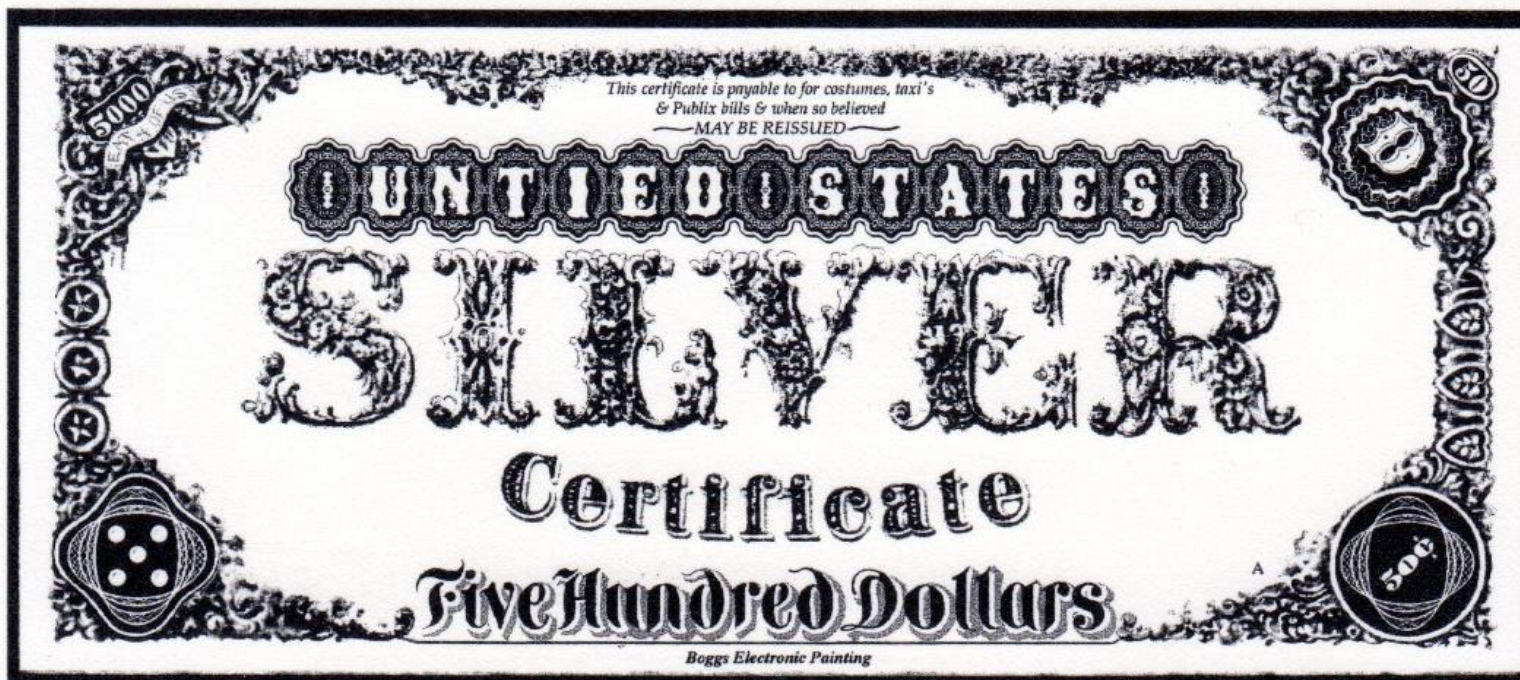

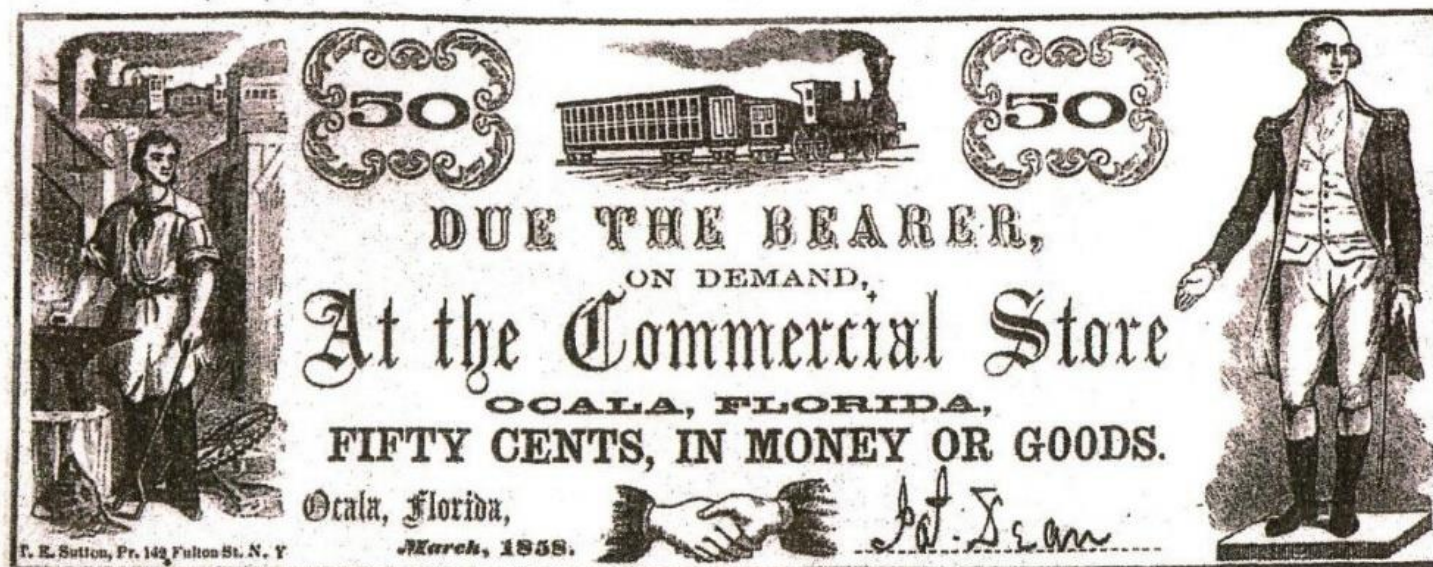


Fig. 171 — Cassidy No. 182. 50¢ scrip of I. L. Dean, Commercial Store. Signed by I. L. Dean. Engraved date of March 1858. Probably unique. (Courtesy of American Numismatic Society, New York, N.Y.)

1830-1831 \$2.00 issue of the Territory of Florida, Tallahassee, Florida

This special issue received approval of the Territorial Legislative Council of Florida on November 22, 1828, and were 6% interest bearing notes. All notes were made payable to John Y. Garey, or to the bearer. The 10th in a series of Collectorama Souvenir Cards. Limited to only 500 cards.

National Bank Notes of Chicago Neighborhoods: The Interstate National Bank of Hegewisch, Illinois Charter # 8605



Rogers Park, Austin, Hyde Park, Lawndale, Kenwood, and Hegewisch. Those familiar with Chicago, Illinois recognize these historic neighborhoods. These and other communities of the "Windy City" have distinctive pasts that exist in history as vibrant independent towns with local politics, industries, and financial institutions. After becoming part of Chicago, the National Banks in these neighborhoods continued to issue currency to their customers and communities in the form of National Bank Notes. These beautiful bank notes are a reminder of the colorful history and diversity of these Chicago communities. The Interstate National Bank of Hegewisch received its charter in March 1907. The bank was named for its location on the border of Illinois and Indiana in the Chicago neighborhood of Hegewisch.

Hegewisch is a small ethnic community located on the far southeast side of Chicago surrounded by factories, grain elevators, highways, industry, and railroads. It was the railroad connecting the west to Chicago and the ports of Lake Michigan that inspired Achilles Hegewisch, President of the United States Rolling Stock Company, to found the area of Hegewisch in 1883. He obtained a post office with the idea of creating a company community modeled after the nearby Pullman Company's success. He set up large shops, plants, and financial relationships for the developing community. The area covers only fifteen hundred acres east of the Calumet River on the banks of Wolf Lake. Hegewisch became part of a rapidly expanding Chicago when it was annexed in 1889.
